Altar Working Tips:

- Breath mint
- ONE person leading in prayer.
- Introduce yourself, get their name.
- Repentance is necessary.
- Use first person plural pronouns (<u>We're</u> going to...<u>let's</u> lift <u>our</u> hands...etc.)
- Speak out.
- Encourage praise and worship: (not begging)

"I praise you Lord"

"I love you Jesus"

"You're such a great God"

"...a Mighty God"

"...an Awesome God"

"Thank you Jesus."

"Thank you for the Holy Ghost."

- Use discretion when ministering in the laying on of hands.
 Remember:
 - ≻ Gender
 - \succ Distraction
 - ➢ Permission
 - ➤ Instruction

- No backrubs, chin rubs...we can't give them the Spirit!
- Keep your eyes and ears open. (Acts 8:14-18; Acts 10:44-48)
- Be aware of our tone of voice. Yelling in someone's ear will distract from the purpose.

• <u>Isaiah 28:11 KJV</u>

"For with stammering lips and another tongue will he speak to this people."

- There will come a time as we're praying that it feels like sounds want to come out...speak what you feel, even if it simply sounds like sounds. Don't feel like you have to go back to your first tongue. It's our spirit yielding to the Spirit of God.
- ▶ Receive it by faith, by faith, speak what you're feeling.
- Seasoned Spirit-filled believers' tongues at times sound conversational. Remember... they've yielded to that for a long time.
- Those sounds are the sounds of life. As we yield to it, more will come.
- "That's it, you're doing great, it's happening."
- Talk to individual when they've finished praying...telling them what you witnessed...ask, "Do you know what that is?"
- With sensitivity, know when to stop someone. We don't want this to be something they don't look forward to if they prayed till they were tired, hoarse.
